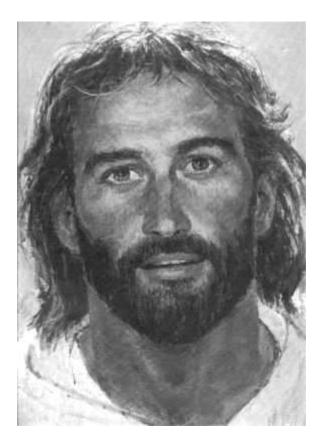

The Rector & Wardens have accepted an offer to purchase the Rectory for \$ 155,000.00 with the following conditions:

- 1. The property is sold in "as is" condition
- 2. The property is in the Registry System. The Purchaser accepts the property in the Registry System and shall not request the vendor to convert it into Qualified Land Titles.
- 3. The sale is conditional upon the vendor finalizing the severance prior to Closing
- 4. The property being sold excluded that portion of land required to be transferred to the Region of Niagara as a condition of severance.
- 5. This offer is conditional upon the approval of the Vestry Meeting of St. Paul's, the Bishop of the Niagara, and the synod of the Diocese by August 6,2011.
- 6. This offer is conditional upon a legal contract being drawn up with the lawyers of both parties regarding the creation of a parking lot between the Rectory and "He's Not Here"

The Vestry Motion for July 17th is as follows:

The Vestry of St. Paul's Anglican Church, Fort Erie accept the offer to purchase the Rectory for \$ 155,000.00 with all of the conditions described in Schedule A of the Agreement of Purchase. (as they are listed above)

Ministry Covenant

WHEREAS: St. John's Anglican Church, Ridgemount and St. Paul's Anglican Church, Fort Erie share a common heritage.

AND WHEREAS: the corporations of both parishes have developed a new ministry model that upholds both faith communities, allowing each to grow and to live out the diocesan vision.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. St. John's and St. Paul's will seek the permission of the Bishop of Niagara to enter into an association whereby each will mutually support the ministry of the other and further God's mission in the world.

The Rector of St. Paul's, or designated substitute, will preside at the Eucharist at St. John's at 9:30am on the second and fourth Sundays of each month. Morning Prayer will be offered at St. John's at 9:30a.m. on the first and third Sundays of the each month led by the volunteer liturgical leadership of both St. John's and St. Paul's. St. Paul's will continue to offer Eucharistic worship each Sunday at 8:00a.m and 10:00 a.m.

- 2. In the months where there is a fifth Sunday, both parishes will worship together at St. Paul's utilizing the liturgical and volunteer resources of both congregations.
- 3. The Rector of St. Paul's will provide pastoral care to the parishioners of St. John's with particular attention to shut-ins, one day a week.
- 4. The Rector of St. Paul's will attend all corporation meetings at both parishes and will chair the annual vestry meetings for both parishes.
- 5. St. John's will be billed \$20,000.00 through the Diocesan payroll invoicing in the amount of \$1666.67 monthly. This amount will be deducted from St John's bank account by PAP and paid to the Diocese. St. Paul's will be billed monthly for the full compensation package less \$1,666.67.
- 6. St. Paul's and St. John's will retain their separate corporations and will operate as separate entities, with one annual meeting of both corporations being held.
- 7. A joint meeting of both corporations must be held if either St. John's or St. Paul's Wardens so signify.
- 8. St. Paul's will make available their office space and equipment for the use of St. John's as needed.
- 9. St. Paul's & St. John's will publish a common Christmas, Easter, Pentecost and Thanksgiving newsletters.
- 10. This association will begin November 1, 2011.
- 11. St. John's and St. Paul's corporations will review this association annually by November 1 of each calendar year.

Deacon Report to Vestry – 2011

It was a privilege and joy to serve as the vocational deacon at St. Paul's in 2011, a year of many changes for me in particular.

As most of you know, I retired from the practice of law, effective Dec. 31, 2011. The only legal work I shall continue to do is to sit as a Deputy Judge of the Small Claims Court. I want to thank all of you for the many kind remarks, gifts, and encouragement I have received. It was wonderful to see so many parishioners, along with newcomers, lawyers and friends at my retirement party in November. It was a humbling experience.

In 2011 my role as Deacon was much the same as before. I assisted at the Eucharist, did visits to Douglas Memorial Hospital, helped out at Feed the Soul, and tried to assist where ever possible. My law practice with refugees, my volunteer work with the Fort Erie Multicultural Centre, Vive La Casa (a refugee shelter in Buffalo) and other organizations with refugees constituted some of my work at the edges of society. In August, I attended a conference of Canadian Anglican Deacons in London, Ont. which enabled me to hear some great speakers and learn from my colleagues across Canada. I also attended Diocesan Synod for the College of Deacons.

In late 2011 came the wonderful news about St. John's and their decision to come back to St. Paul's. The schedule that has been worked out has me at St. John's on the third Sunday of the month leading Morning Prayer at 9:30 A.M. The reception I have received has, in the words of Bishop Spence, been "simply lovely".

As I begin to sort out what means to be retired, I ask for your prayers. Mark and I shall be meeting to discuss what changes this will mean for my role at St. Paul's and St. John's. I am continuing as a board member of the Fort Erie Multicultural Centre and have joined the Board of Vive La Casa in Buffalo. Vive, by the way, is the largest refugee shelter in the United States and was founded in 1985 to assist refugees to enter Canada lawfully. I am also chair of a local group planning the reaction of the organizations assisting refugees with the huge changes in refugee law coming in June.

I have been told by so many of you that I shall my time well used in retirement. My prayer is that I use it in the service of God.

May the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all.

Rector's Vestry Report - 2011

"Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?" This promise that comes from The Baptismal Covenant represents what I think is our particular challenge for this coming year. We do many things well at St. Paul's, there are many opportunities to grow and share your particular gifts with others here. But like most churches we may not be so good at the "will you seek" part. If folks come we welcome them, if they want to join there is a place for them. But we don't do a lot of seeking them out.

I think it is fair to say that we attract our share of Christians in Fort Erie to St. Paul's; folks who 'get' liturgy, classical based music, and who are looking for a faith tradition that values human beings of all walks of life. If we are to grow our ministry at St. Paul's and expose our faith and community to a wider group of people it may be time to 'seek' some new opportunities beyond what we have traditionally offered. This is not to say we need or have any desire to change what we do on Sunday mornings other than to offer the best worship experience we can in the tradition and style that is ours. But there are other opportunities and occasions during the week when we can offer something different.

We have the best movie theatre in Fort Erie in our parish hall. A group of people could form around offering movies to make people think on a regular schedule. We preserved the best part of the stage, and our church is an excellent music hall. A group of people could form around seeking out and offering concerts and performers that stretch our present offerings to attract a new and different audience to St. Paul's. We have a wonderful Sunday School, a group of people could form around offering Professional Development Day programs to children, a great opportunity to be of service and to share our faith with the community. There are other opportunities for us to do ministry that perhaps you've thought of, we need you to share them, so that a group might form to offer service and faith to our community.

As we think of ways to grow and extend our ministry, we also have to give thanks for what we have. Few churches are as beautiful as St. Paul's especially at Christmas, we are pretty much the last congregation in Fort Erie with a music program that includes a choir that can sing in 4 parts, the ACW and St. Nick's ladies continue to do an outstanding job of providing friendship to one another and service to the parish and community, and our parish centre is used every single day of the week and often by more than one group or organization, we are home to both Meals on Wheels, Niagara Speech Therapy and Fort Erie Co-operative Pre-School. The community clearly understands that St. Paul's is a congregation that understands that we are here to serve.

My thanks go to all of you for your dedication and willingness to serve St. Paul's and by extension our community. This year as we seek to serve Christ in all persons, may God bless us all and our parish with growth and continued vitality.
